The letter of intent to apply is due August 8th, 2024.
- 2. Request that KanCare utilize its Rate Study review process to prioritize raising the reimbursement for birth center facility services immediately. \$1295 does not cover the cost of birth center expenses including nurse salaries and the building. \$1295 is what Doulas are paid as of July 1, 2024.
- 3. Use your creativity and relationships at the state and federal level to support this Midwife Led Birth Center as it seeks a future partnership with a Federally Qualified Health Center (FQHC).
